MANAGERS CORNER

AIRBNB IN THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES

It is important for all residents to understand that the laws in the City of Coral Gables *prohibit* short term rentals in certain areas of the City. Listing a property located in a prohibited area for less than six (6) months is a violation of the City's Zoning Code and is punishable by a fine of \$150 per day until compliance is achieved. See Florida Statute 212.03 for more information.

In addition, Biltmore II Condominium Association does not allow for rentals of less than one (1) year. (See Rules & Regulations, Article 26.2 and Declaration of Condominium, Amendment February 12th, 2018, Article XII.D). No subleasing is permitted.

SHOPPING CARTS IN HALLWAYS

We remind all residents that grocery carts, strollers, floor mats and other materials (see Rules & Regulations, Article 6.5) may not be placed or left in hallways. Fines for up to \$100 a day may be assessed to residents not following this rule.

MEET OUR SIGNATURE SCREW PINE TREES

Inside the east and west bends of our main entrance driveway stand two 40-foot tall trees that appear to be standing on their toes and looking surprisingly like exotic Christmas trees - see picture below. Let's get to know them a bit better. In Latin, the scientific language used to name plants, our trees are named Pandanus utilis. The Pandanus genus includes more than 650 species from Pacific Ocean tropics and subtropics. In their native region, they are second only to the Coconut Palm in importance. Our species (utilis) can grow to over 60-feet tall. In the tropical Pacific islands, this tree is found along the coastline within the tidal zone. Roots tolerate saltwater and they appear to be arranged in a pyramid shape supporting the heavy tree above. These visible prop roots grow downward from the above ground trunk (known as "adventitious" roots) and are in addition to the below ground root system. Prop roots are very strong and protect the tree from tidal surge and strong winds. Common names for Pandanus trees include "Pandan" and "Screw Pine". If you look closely at the trunk and branches, there are noticeable rings around them, looking like the threads of a screw. They are caused by the leaves where they attach to the tree and produce a ring-like scar when the dead leaves fall off. The word "Pine" comes from the appearance of the large fruit which resembles a large Pineapple. Screw Pines are dioecious - male and female flowers are on different plants. Our two specimens are male since the flowers appear on a long hanging structure called a panicle. Also, our trees do not produce the pineapple shape fruit – a function that only the female plant can fulfill. The unique appearance and sheer size of this tree results in an emphatic statement when it appears in a planned landscape. The two Screw Pine trees at Biltmore II are perfectly placed as the Signature plants at the main entrance.

Treats they Won't Give Away

It's back to school time! Below is a delicious and healthy treat to add to your child's packed lunch.

- 2 cups rolled oats
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup wheat germ
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup raisins (optional)
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Generously grease a 9x13 inch baking pan.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix together the oats, brown sugar, wheat germ, cinnamon, flour, raisins and salt. Make a well in the center, and pour in the honey, egg, oil and vanilla. Mix well using your hands. Pat the mixture evenly into the prepared pan.
- Bake for 30 to 35 minutes in the preheated oven, until the bars begin to turn golden at the edges. Cool for 5 minutes, then cut into bars while still warm. Do not allow the bars to cool completely before cutting, or they will be too hard to cut.
