

Scary Tidbits



FOOD:

Water- 1 gallon per person per day & 1 gallon for cooking and hygiene Special Dietary needs items Small containers of meat, fish, soup, fruit, vegetables, fruit juice, dried foods

Cereal, pasta, rice, bread, crackers, protein bars, nuts, peanut butter Canned or bottled juices Salt, sugar, honey, pepper Evaporated milk/powdered milk/ or formula/baby food

KITCHEN ACCESSORIES:

Manual Can Opener Paper plates, cups, towels, knives, forks, spoons, cooking pots, utility knife

Aluminum foil / plastic re-sealable bags

TOOLS:

Needles and thread Duct tape Wrench, screwdriver and pliers Flashlights, extra paper and pencils Batteries, candles, matches Battery powered radio/TV

HYGIENE ITEMS:

Soap/Shampoo Waterless soap Sanitary napkins/toilet paper/paper towels Plastic garbage bags Bleach, liquid detergent Deodorant Toothpaste, toothbrush, brush / comb Change of clothing, extra socks, and extra underwear Raingear, waterproof hats Towels, blankets, sleeping bags, sturdy shoes, beach chairs

First aid kit Prescription meds, insulin, antibiotic ointment, antihistamine Scissors Non-Prescription pain meds Anti-Diarrhea meds

ENTERTAINMENT:

Games, books, puzzles

<u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>:

Spare keys to home and vehicle Copies of important papers in a plastic bag

Cash (small bills) as the power will prevent credit card usage and all ATMs won't work

PET HURRICANE SUPPLIES:

Pets should have proper ID Including name, address, and phone # Photo of pet and owner (to prove ownership)

Up-to-date veterinarian records Flea and Tick prevention/treatments Proper leash, collar and appropriate pet carrier (1 per Pet)
