The FSR associates got together for the monthly safety meeting for the month of May, which was held in both English and Spanish.



It is reported that, on average, heat illnesses killed more people in the last 10 years than any other weather event. Knowing the risks and the signs of heat exposure and illness can help you stay safe, even on the hottest days.

The word **HEAT** can help us stay safe:

- ydrate. Whether you feel thirsty or not, drink plenty of water to avoid becoming dehydrated, especially when you're working or exercising outside.
- ducate yourself. Keep up with the latest temperature and heat index forecasts and current readings (take actions to stay cool and safe when the temperatures hits 85 degrees or the heat index hits 90 degrees). Know the warning signs of a heat illness, and how you can stay cool.
- Act quickly when a heat illness is suspected. Seek medical attention immediately for any of these warning signs: cramping, rapid pulse, heavy sweating, hot red skin, dizziness, confusion, nausea, vomiting.
- ake it easy. Anyone working or exercising outdoors should avoid overexertion, especially between the hours of 11 am and 6 pm. Take hourly breaks in the shade or in air conditioning.



Los informes indican que, en promedio, las enfermedades producidas por el calor fueron la causa de muerte de más personas en los últimos 10 años que cualquier otro evento climático. Conocer los riesgos y las señales de la exposición al calor y las enfermedades que provoca puede ayudarle a mantenerse seguro, incluso en los días más calientes.

La palabra HEAT (CALOR) puede ayudarnos a mantenernos seguros:

- idrátese. Ya sea que tenga sed o no, tome mucha agua para evitar deshidratarse, especialmente cuando trabaje o haga ejercicios en exteriores.
- dúquese. Manténgase al tanto de las últimas predicciones y los indicadores de temperatura e índice de calor (tome medidas para mantenerse fresco y seguro cuando las temperaturas lleguen a los 85 grados o el índice de calor alcance los 90 grados). Conozca las señales de advertencia de una enfermedad producida por el calor y cómo mantenerse fresco.
- Actúe rápidamente cuando sospeche que tiene una dolencia producida por el calor. Busque atención médica inmediatamente para cualquiera de estas señales de advertencia: calambres, pulso acelerado, sudoración excesiva, piel rojiza y caliente, mareos, confusión, náuseas, vómitos.
- Tómelo con calma. Cualquier persona que esté trabajando o ejercitándose en exteriores debe evitar el agotamiento, especialmente entre las 11 a.m. y las 6 p.m. Tome recesos cada hora en la sombra o en un sitio con aire acondicionado.

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
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
